Entry requirements

You will need a minimal level of skills in listening, speaking, reading and writing. Proof of COVID-19 vaccination is required. The minimum age requirement is 17 years unless an exemption has been provided.

You will need to apply for and receive a Police Check and Working with Children Check.

Considerations

Attendance at evening meetings and occasional weekend activities can be expected. Community work also requires extensive travel within local and regional communities and considerable personal contact with community members from all walks of life. Understanding of cultural issues in attending to the needs of individuals is required.

Government funding is available for eligible persons.
